Tiny Bees have been busy getting ready for Halloween. We have explored pumpkins, created scary creatures with plasticine and decorated some witches hats with paint.



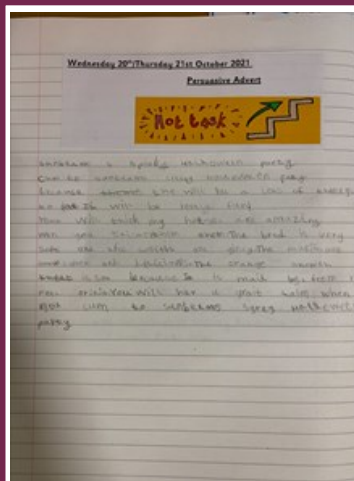
Sunbeams

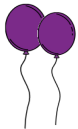


Dates for the diary

- Tuesday 7th December—Locala flu vaccinations—Reception to Year 6—only for children who have consented

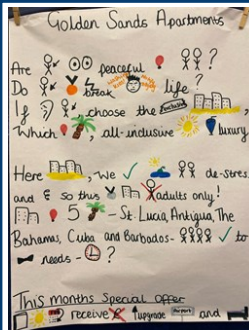
Birthday Celebrations
